

# THEY'RE COMING AFTER YOUR PENSION

The government has announced that all public sector workers will pay on average an extra 3% towards their pension. For support staff, this could mean paying £525 more a year. A teacher would pay on average £1,011 more and a headteacher £1,734 more. All of this on top of a two-year pay freeze.

Teachers and support staff may also be forced to work until age 66.

And yet if the proposed career average pension scheme is implemented instead of final salary, this would result in teachers and support staff receiving 25% less in pension benefits during their retirement.

Both the Teachers' Pension Scheme and the Local Government Pension Scheme have undergone recent reviews, making them more affordable and sustainable in the long term. ATL argues there is no need for this triple whammy.
